### **Kubota Gardens** – 9817 55th Avenue S., Seattle WA

A 20 acre city park blending Japanese garden design and Pacific Northwest plants. Wonderful collection of plants, stone, water features and Japanese style bridges. Located in south Seattle.

Entrance is free. Tripods allowed.

### **Bellevue Botanical Garden** - 12001 Main Street, Bellevue WA

53-acres of cultivated gardens, restored woodlands, and natural wetlands.

### **Japanese Gardens** – Washington Park Arboretum, Seattle WA

Located SE of the University of Washington Campus

3½ acres of formal gardens and a Tea House.

Entrance fee \$6.00 for adults - \$4.00 for seniors

Tripods not allowed

Sunday hours: 10:00am to 7:00pm

The Arboretum itself has many scenic areas and is free and tripods are permitted.

### **University of Washington** – Main Campus, Seattle WA

Entrance to one of the underground parking garages is off 15<sup>th</sup> Ave NE near NE 41<sup>st</sup> Street. Interesting architecture and grounds.

**Pioneer Square and The Pike Place Market** – Both are located off 1<sup>st</sup> Ave in downtown Seattle. Both offer many photographic opportunities and both are likely to be crowded any time of year. The Square is located at the south end of 1<sup>st</sup> Ave. at Yesler Way and the Market is about 1½ miles north at Pike Street.

**Glazer's Camera** – 430 8<sup>th</sup> Ave. North, Seattle WA Sunday hours noon to 5pm  
Not a photo site but a great stop for photographers. This is the premier camera and photo supply store in Seattle. They are located on both sides of the street.
